

The Burton Gunpowder Company

An illustrated talk by Chris Rowley Chair of the Leigh Historical Society



Chris Rowley has extensively researched the Burton family involvement in the manufacture of gunpowder. James Burton, the founder of St Leonards, invested considerably in the industry from 1811.

The Gunpowder Mills were based at Leigh near Tonbridge. They were initially known as the Ramhurst Powder Mills, later the Tunbridge Gunpowder Works. The business was managed by James Burton in conjunction with his eldest son, William Ford Burton.

After James died, William continued to run the business until his death in 1856. His brother Alfred then took over. He later became mayor of Hastings.
